



Château de Ruth stands in Sainte-Cécile-les-Vignes, to the north-east of Orange in hearth terroir of southern Rhone Valley. The domain is one of the oldest in the Rhone Valley, its name first appeared in 1561. It shelters, under Louis XIV, a convent of which remains the remains. Vincent Moreau fell under the charms of this beautiful property on an exceptional terroir and quality of this vineyard, he bought it in 2010. He devotes all his know-how and enthusiasm to product quality wines from the exceptional terroir of red clays and river stones.

<u>Vallée du Rhône Vintage 2019</u>: Although individual berries were smaller than usual this year, the Rhône Valley's 2019 harvests are not far off the 10-year average. After 2018's very wet spring, 2019 has been much drier yet the vineyards stood up extraordinarily well to summer's heat and drought, delivering a crop of impeccably healthy grapes. The overall result is a good balance between of acidity to alcohol bringing a pleasing feeling of freshness.

About the vines

Grape varieties: Grenache 70%, Syrah 30% Harvested manually in August 29, 2019

Age: between 10 and 30 years

Vines orientation: South

Pruning: Cordon de Royat pruning,

Yield: 35hl/h

Farming practice: sustainable HEV certification level 3

Soil: Clay-limestone

Winemaking: Thermo-regulated tanks and pre-fermentation maceration

Tasting notes: This wine has an elegant red ruby color and nice fruity aromas. The nose is expressive with cherry and raspberry fragrances. On the palate, it's round and soft with black fruits flavors. Tannins are fine and elegant for a really charming wine.

Suggested food pairing: beef carpaccio, duck burger, gratin Dauphinois, chicken barbecue, Rabbit in cream sauce, cheese
